<u>Uses</u>

1. Biodiesel Production: Seeds yield non-edible oil, ideal for biodiesel.

2. Medicinal Applications: Leaves, seeds, and latex are used for traditional remedies (e.g., wound healing, anti-inflammatory).

3. Soil Erosion Control: Acts as a hedge to prevent soil loss.

4. Organic Fertilizer: Seed cake, rich in nutrients, is used as compost.

- 5. Biopesticides: Extracts repel insects and pests.
- 6. Soap Making: Oil is used in soap and detergent manufacturing.
- 7. Illuminant: Oil is burned in lamps in rural areas.
- 8. Bioenergy Source: Used for generating electricity and heat.
- 9. Animal Feed: Detoxified seed cake is used as a protein source.
- 10. Biogas Production: Seed cake is fermented to produce methane.
- 11. Paint and Varnish Production: Oil is used as a base for paints.
- 12. Sustainable Forestry: Grows in arid areas, restoring degraded land.
- 13. Livestock Fencing: Dense hedges protect fields and animals.
